



APPROXIMATELY 202 MILES

From Petersburg south, the route enters the Seneca Rocks National Recreation Area. At the majestic Seneca Rocks, you'll begin to climb mountain roads, then turn north through the South Fork Valley. Follow the river to Moorefield then onto Old Route 55, a less traveled, scenic ride. Beyond Wardensville, head west on US RT 50, a national coast to coast road twisting and bending its way across WV, mostly as a two-lane trek. Turning south, you will finish the route traveling along a winding, rolling country road.

City of Petersburg Park Pavilions with fireplaces, basketball, baseball field, gazebo, swimming pool with dives and slide; walking trail on the nearby flood control dike; 51 Park St. Petersburg; (304) 257-1725

Davis House Museum One of the oldest buildings in Petersburg, dating c.1840; purchased by Methodists Congregation 1890 then by the Grant County Historical Society in 2011; houses a museum of area artifacts; 105 N Main St., Petersburg.

Fort Mulligan Well preserved earthen fort. Visit the interpretive site, walk the trails and read the history of the unfolding Civil War events. Additional markers nearby. Adjacent to GC Hospital off US RT 28/55.

Hometown Christmas Petersburg A celebration held in City Park. Music, activities, cookies and cocoa; Free; early Dec; 51 Park St. Petersburg; (304) 257-9266.

Davis House Built c.1798. Home to Davis family. Two sons fought in the Civil War, one for the Confederacy & one for the Union. Museum with Civil War artifacts & period furnishings. Tours arranged at the Public Library. 197 W Main St, Romney, (304) 822-3185.

Ft. Mill Ridge Civil War Trenches Among the best-preserved civil war trenches in the nation. Built by Union troops, the fort has an outer ring of entrenchments and a central redoubt for artillery. Trail brochure available. Open dawn to dusk; (304) 822-4320; US RT 50 near Core Road.

Whipple Truss Bridge Built in 1874 on US RT 50 near Romney. Moved in 1938 to west of Capon Springs over Cacapon River. In use until 1991. Oldest of the few Whipple Trusses left in WV. On National Register of Historic Places.
